- 5- If it felt like I was pushing a boulder upstream, rather than going with the flow, I knew I had to change plans. October 2, 2012, I boarded the flight to Florence, Italy. Behind me: my son and daughter and a life never lived. Ahead of me: unknown. And all of that was just fine until the plane was about 3 hours over the Atlantic Ocean. There weren't any tears this time, just a sinking feeling that began at the base of my stomach, and moved to my throat.
